Dear People of Advent,

Preaching on Isaiah 7:14 over a century ago, the great preacher Charles Spurgeon closed his sermon with this flourish:

"God with us." It is hell's terror. Satan trembles at the sound of it; the blackwinged dragon of the pit quails before it. Let him come to you suddenly, and do you but whisper that word, "God with us," back he falls, confounded and confused. "God with us" is the laborer's strength; how could he preach the gospel, how could he bend his knees in prayer, how could the missionary go into foreign lands, how could the martyr stand at the stake, how could the confessor own his Master, how could men labor, if that one word were taken away? "God with us" is the sufferer's comfort, the balm of his woe, the alleviation of his misery, the sleep which God gives to his beloved, their rest after exertion and toil. "God with us" is eternity's sonnet, heaven's hallelujah, the shout of the glorified, the song of the redeemed, the chorus of angels, the everlasting oratorio of the great orchestra of the sky."

Thanks, Spurgeon, for reminding us all of our deepest resource for life today and the true joy of Christmas: "God with us." And so, Church of the Covenant, if you see me either moping around or stressed out this Advent, will you please remind me? "God with us." And would you join me in experiencing the reality of "God with us" this Advent season in corporate worship? We have a whole month of services planned for you, all leading up to our Christmas Eve services. Once again I invite you and encourage you to come to either the 9 a.m. Contemporary Candlelight or the 7 p.m. Traditional Candlelight service. Again, what an opportunity to celebrate and to invite family and friends to worship the Savior whose name is Immanuel, "God with us."

To celebrate Christmas, we have listed some of the books in the Carnahan Library that have Christmas themes. If you would like to read a Christmas book, you can browse the shelves for books with a

Christmas tree on their spines or check the card catalog's SUBJECT FILE by looking up "Christmas."

God is in the Small Stuff at Christmas by Bruce Bickel and Stan Jantz. Want to really experience Christmas this year? Join popular authors Bruce Bickel and Stan Jantz for an inspiring look at the marvelous season of Jesus' birth. Featuring 41 chapters on the characters and places, symbols and celebrations, and thoughts and feelings of the Christmas season, this book combines the best features of a devotional with the traditional appeal of an Advent book. God is in the Small Stuff at Christmas will inspire you to celebrate the true wonder of Jesus' birth.

Clear Cove Christmas by Debbie Macomber. Mother-to-be Mary Jo Wyse arrives in Cedar Cove on Christmas Eve, searching for her baby's father. David Rhodes had said he would be in town — but he isn't. This leaves Mary Jo stranded, pregnant and alone. There's no room at the local inn, so Grace Harding brings Mary Jo home to her nearby ranch. She and her husband, Cliff, have a houseful of guests, but they offer her a room over their stable (currently sheltering the animals including a donkey and a camel for Cedar Cove's Nativity pageant!). When Mary Jo goes into labor that night, a young man named Mack McAfee, a paramedic, comes to her rescue just as her brothers, the three Wyse men, show up in town. The people of Cedar Cove join them in celebrating the birth of baby Noel, but no one has more to celebrate than Mack. Because this Christmas brings him faith, hope and love.

The Christmas Ouilt by Kelly Ann Riley. The main character of the series is Sarah, a widow in her sixties who, when she is not working at her quilt restoration business, solves mysteries in her small, New England town. In this particular mystery, someone is shoplifting from the local shops at Christmas time and after her twin granddaughters are falsely accused, Sarah sets out to find the actual culprit. At the same time, she is trying to make a Christmas quilt for her best friend Martha from a daily email instruction pattern, but something on the instructions each day just doesn't make sense. Can Sarah figure out the answers to both of the mysteries?

Where Angels Go by Debbie Macomber. This book is a charming interlude where you will become involved with three wonderful people who need help and three mischievous young Ambassador Angels whom Archangel Gabriel sends to help them. These enchanting angels are Shirley, Goodness, and Mercy. Gabriel knows their hearts are in the right places, even though they are tempted to help the people too much He gives them a chance to prove they have matured since their last assignments on earth. Is he mistaken? Angel Shirley is assigned to help a nine-year-old boy, Carter Jackson, get a dog for Christmas. Does Shirley really help, or does she complicate matters when a stray follows the boy home? Does Mercy always obey Gabriel's rules while helping a dying man, Harry Alderwood, fulfill his wish for his wife Rosalie to be settled in a comfortable residential care facility before his time is up? And then there is Goodness who is assigned to help a young divorcee, Beth Fischer, find love and happiness. But is Angel Goodness obedient when she finds humans too "slow" in solving their own problems?

The Purpose of Christmas by Richard Warren who expounds on the profound origins of Christmas and shows how we can welcome the season of peace into our lives. Pastor Rick Warren sounds the clarion call to "remember the reason for the season," taking us on a journey back in time to the most wonderful story of all — the birth of the baby Jesus. Regardless of your background, Christmas is the best news you can ever receive. Through stirring imagery and compelling personal insights, The Purpose of Christmas honors the significance and promise of this cherished holiday. Pastor Warren encourages you to identify and confront what drains peace from your life. He explains that the way to respond to these "peace-robbers" is to learn how to surrender to God's will and not feel defeated or discouraged when life does not go as planned. True peace of mind is found by having unshakeable faith knowing that God will guide you through life's challenges. The Purpose of Christmas will exhilarate you to honor the true significance of Christmas and to nurture God's gifts of love and peace in this world.

<u>O Holy Night</u> by Julie Hogan combines poetry, essays, scenic photographs, and paintings to depict the Holy Land at the time of Christ's birth. Here is a book that traces the coming of Jesus, from prophecy to fulfillment, while also presenting the Judean culture — its customs, people, and landscape — into which Jesus was born. Includes beautiful photographs of historical paintings and drawings.

The Miraculous Journey: Anticipating God in the Christmas Season by Marty Bullis. During the hustle and bustle of the weeks leading up to Christmas, we sometimes forget what it is all about. These 29 daily Advent devotionals from a fresh new voice will help readers attend to the gospel story of Jesus in deeper, more meaningful ways. After reading the selected Scripture verse for the day, Bullis' short devotional reading will help you unpack deeper meanings of the text. Then, through guided reflection, prayer, and journaling, you will engage in this time of holy waiting. Even those whose Christian faith traditions do not include celebrating Advent will find these devotions a way to combat the frantic consumer mentality of the Christmas season.

Wish for Christmas: A Cape Light Novel by Thomas Kinkade and Katherine Spencer. After serving in Iraq, David has returned home to find that his widowed father has remarried. Jobless and dealing with physical injuries that may never heal, David doesn't have much Christmas cheer, especially when Christine, his ex-girlfriend, comes to work at his father's tree farm. Trying not to seem bitter or discouraged is even harder than the physical therapy he must undergo, and David realizes that he not only needs to heal his body but his heart as well. Meanwhile, Lillian Warwick's daughters are concerned about their elderly, yet fiercely independent, mother living on her own. Even her old friend, Dr. Ezra Elliot, can't get through to her. When the tables are turned and Ezra needs her help, they are both surprised to find they value each other beyond just friendship. And Lillian begins to wonder if it is still possible to let love into her life.


